Additional information: The Cathedral Library in Abbey House will be open each evening from 7.00 pm until the talk begins. There is car parking on Angel Hill.

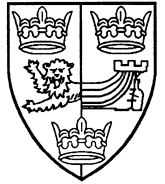

Our Speakers this Lent

Malcolm Brown is Director of the Mission and Public Affairs Division of the Church of England, engaged especially in issues of economics and secularism. He previously worked as a parish priest and as Principal of the Eastern Region Ministry Course. He has published widely on topics in Christian ethics, including the recent textbook *Tensions in Christian Ethics*.

David Shreeve is co-founder with David Bellamy of the Conservation Foundation and is environmental consultant to the Church of England, organising its national campaign 'Shrinking the Footprint'. With Claire Foster he is the author of *Don't Stop at the Lights* and *How many Lightbulbs does it Take to Change a Christian?*

Brendan McCarthy is adviser to the Church of England on issues of medical ethics and health and social care. He was previously a rector and hospital chaplain in the Church of Ireland and has been strongly engaged in cross-community work in Northern Ireland.

Jenny Kartupelis is Director of the East of England Faiths Council, which she established 11 years ago and which supports local inter-faith work and fosters good relations between the faith and public sectors. She is engaged in research into government policy towards religious faiths and in 2010 was awarded the MBE for her services to inter-faith relations.

Mary Grey is Visiting Professor at St Mary's University College, Twickenham, having previously held chairs in theology at Southampton, Lampeter and Nijmegen. She has longstanding involvement in charitable and reconciliation work in India, Rwanda and Palestine. She has written extensively on feminist and liberation theology, and her most recent book is *The Resurrection of Peace: A Gospel Journey to Easter and Beyond*.
