FROM THE VICAR

Dear Friends,

I am writing to you first this weekend about the season of Lent this year. Lent is traditionally a time of renewal of faith in God, and of love for our Lord Jesus Christ, and of awareness of the work of the Holy Spirit in the fellowship of the Church.

In this time of testing and restrictions, which is in itself a kind of enforced fasting from many of the normal processes and pleasures of life, I would like to suggest that Lent is an even more important time for us all this year. There is an important action you can take straightaway in preparation for Lent, which is detailed at the end of this letter.

ASH WEDNESDAY (17th Feb)

However, my first recommendation is that you do not think of giving anything more up for Lent this year. We are all having to give up enough already. Instead it would be better to think about what you are going to do.

Lent begins on Wednesday 17th February and we will live stream an Ash Wednesday Choral Eucharist at 6.30pm. In this time when one week blurs into the next, I would like to call you to observe Ash Wednesday by making a point of joining this service by live stream either at the time or by watching the video later that evening. Do try and observe the day itself at some point.

LENT REFLECTIONS: ROOTED IN LOVE

I have looked around at the Lent resources being published this year and have chosen one particular book as offering a flexible and interesting way in which we can try and keep Lent together this year. "Rooted in Love – Lent reflections on life in Christ" is a collection of 40 reflections written by the team of bishops in London, and edited by the Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally. There are six contributors in all, which gives a good variety of styles and outlooks.

The reflections are organised into five themed sections, so one way of using the book is to follow a section for each of the main weeks of Lent. Of course you could just follow the reflections through each of the 40 days of Lent, but alternatively you could select two or three per week and just think about those. This means that if there are contributors whom you find more helpful, you could stick to those each week.

It would be possible to form a weekly group with several others by Zoom, and agree some way of sharing thoughts about each section. I am planning to lead a parish course by Zoom using this book like this, leading a session each week which takes three reflections from a section, and gives opportunity for some discussion in small breakout groups.

So there are several ways in which people could engage with this Lent book. We could end each session with Compline. I will write again with firm arrangements about this.

ACTION IN PREPARATION FOR LENT

I invite you to order this Lent book anyway and start thinking about how you might like to use it. It is available from the publisher at a £2 discount and with a delivery charge of £1.95, for a total of £9.94.

All the usual outlets seem to be offering the same discount and you may be able to find one that is currently offering free postage at the end of January. I am sorry we can't offer to buy centrally as a church this year, as distribution would be difficult.
